Treasurer's Report

Regular account balance \$1085.43, emergency account \$478.69.

The board approved an expense of \$2.40 monthly to add a spam filter to the DASH email account.

Rotary Funding

DASH received \$700.00 is funding from Rotary. A thank you card will be sent. Rotary funding will be used for and educational brochure and other publication to inform the public about DASH.

UGN (United Good Neighbors)

Pat called Carla at UGN regarding presenting information about DASH at the UGN board meeting. Pat has not heard from Carla yet. The board agreed it was worth pursing so Pat will call Carla again to find out when the UGN boarding meetings are held.

DASH board members discussed what to present and what questions to ask UGN to improve chances of receiving funding. Questions included: was it an issue that DASH asked for operating costs, did UGN need more specific program information on DASH i.e. preventing social isolation, providing safe routes for transportation.

Other Funding Options

Last year Marion met with the director at Seaport and inquired if residents of Seaport Landing would be interested in being on the DASH board and if Seaport would donate funds to support DASH. No response was received. The board decided it would not be worth pursuing this inquiry.

Other potential funding sources mentioned were Quimper Unitarian Church and the Methodist Church. Marion said the Methodist Church puts on concerts once a month and they have donated funds from the concerts to charity.

Travis suggested a goal setting activity for the next board meeting of preparing a marketing presentation highlighting the effect DASH has on the community. Travis can help with a slide presentation.

Accessible Communities Grant

Film Festival (September 25, 26, 27)

The Accessible Communities Act Committee is sponsoring a movie at the Port Townsend Film Festival. The DASH board would like to have brochures to hand out at the festival. A suggestion was to print a small run of the case statement brochures to hand out until a new brochure can be prepared. Others suggestions for handouts included refrigerator magnets, notepads, and donation forms.

Hospital Wayfinding

- Follow up fine tuning the wayfinding report and sending it to DASH's contact at the hospital, Hilary Whittington.

Marion sent a letter to the manager at Fort Worden outlining entertainment venues that needed updating and offering DASH's services for future work.
